Subject: Notice Regarding Yellow Discoloration in Tap Water

Dear Valued Customer.

We are reaching out to inform you about recent reports of **yellow discoloration in the tap water** in certain areas of our service region. We understand that any changes in water appearance can be concerning, and we want to provide you with a clear explanation and reassurance regarding this temporary situation.

What Is Causing the Yellow Color?

The yellow tint you may be noticing is primarily due to **natural iron** in the water, which becomes more visible during seasonal "**turnover**" **events** at our source reservoir. During this time of year, **warmer surface temperatures** can cause the water in the dam to mix, bringing naturally occurring iron and other minerals from the bottom layers up to the surface.

This phenomenon is known as **dam turnover**, and it is a **normal**, **seasonal process** that typically occurs in late summer and early fall as temperatures fluctuate.

Is the Water Safe?

Yes – there are no health risks associated with this discoloration. The yellow color is caused by oxidized iron, which, while it may affect the appearance of the water, does not pose a health hazard.

We regularly test our water and are continuing to monitor the situation closely. The water meets all **state and federal safety standards** for drinking water.

We apologize for any inconvenience and appreciate your understanding. Our team is actively managing this seasonal issue, and we expect water clarity to improve soon.
